Hello Salmon Arm West Families,

What a wonderful Spring season it has been! We are grateful for the rain, not only to see everything in bloom, but also to help keep our lands as wet as possible with the summer months ahead. We have been engaging in so many important conversations with students around protection of our lands, our roles and responsibilities, as well as the importance of the seasons. These important conversations and classroom learnings have tied in nicely with the many outdoor field trips and outdoor learning Salmon Arm West has been engaging in.

From the school-wide field trip to the Wildlife Park in Kamloops, to the Vernon Science Center stations outside, cross-country running on the fields, and field trip for older grades to North Fork Wild, we have truly been enjoying and experiencing nature in its most beautiful forms. We hope you have been able to spend lots of time outdoors as a family, too!

It has been such a successful year for us here, as we reflect on all the learning, growth and strengths our students have acquired. As we begin to enter the month of June, staff have begun the initial stages of planning for the 2024/2025 school year. With our current enrollment, we are projected for 4 Divisions, which would look as follows: K/1, 1/2, 3/4 and 4/5. While we do not have a formal process for classroom placement requests, I always invite families to reach out to me directly before summer break with any information they may like to share with regards to the placement of their child(ren) 's classes for next year. Please note that we will not be able to guarantee any information until September, once all schools know their exact number of students in attendance. Once this has been confirmed, we receive confirmation from the School District as to our number of Divisions. This is a district-wide policy, and we thank you for your patience as we go through the process.

Volunteer appreciation Tea



Volunteer Police Information Checks

SD83 now requires all parents/guardians who volunteer to work with children (unsupervised by the teacher), in the school setting, to have a Police Information Check (PIC) completed by the RCMP. This is of particular importance for parents driving students to sporting events and on field trips. Simply put, if a parent is not on our file at our school for having had a record check completed, she/he can ONLY drive his/her own children. As a result, this may affect sports teams' participation in road games, as well as field trips in our community.

If you would like to get a Police Information Check (PIC) done, please visit the following website: <u>https://justice.gov.bc.ca/eCRC/home.htm</u>

You will be required to enter an Access Code that is unique to School District No. 83. Please contact the school's main office for the Access Code. There is no cost to have a Police Information Check completed and the PIC is valid for five years.

Bussing

Students who ride the bus must be respectful towards the driver of the bus, other students and the property of the bus. The bus driver needs to have a quiet and respectful environment on the bus in order to ensure that all students arrive at school and home in a safe manner. Riding the bus is a privilege and students who do not follow the expectations set for riding the bus may be asked to find an alternate form of transportation to and from school. Students who regularly ride the bus will receive a Bus Orientation early in the school year so all expectations for riding the bus are known and understood.

Students who are not registered are not permitted to ride the bus. Unfortunately, this means regular bus students will not be allowed to have a friend ride the bus to their home for after school activities.



School Health & Safety

SAW is following the SD83 Communicable Disease Safety Plan. This plan can be found on the school website and the SD83 district website.

Kiddos feeling sick?

If your child is ill, we ask that you please keep them home from school to prevent others from getting sick. If you have any questions around symptoms or whether or not your child should stay home, please do not hesitate to call the office!

Nut-aware school

Please note we are a 'Nut-Aware School' (hand washing after eating nut products, no food sharing), with the exception of classrooms where your teacher will inform families they are now a 'Nut-Free' classroom. Thank you for your attention to this.

If your child has any allergies or requires medication, please contact the office immediately to ensure we have the proper documentation and medication at the school office. This includes inhalers for asthma, as well as allergy medications.

If at any point in time you have questions or concerns related to Health & Safety, please contact the school. We would be happy to answer any questions you may have.

School Communication

Our goal is always to keep families informed of school activities and events. Your classroom teacher is the best source of communication for your specific inquiries, as they will have the most up-to-date information pertaining to activities happening within their classroom. Our office secretary, Dani, sends out reminders of upcoming events, and is always available by phone or email (saw@sd83.bc.ca) to answer questions you may have.

Special events within the school or urgent information needing to be shared will be emailed directly from the Principal. Please ensure you are checking emails regularly, and if at any point you require paper copies of information to go home, please let us know.
